
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

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Summer learning loss

- Children lose an average of more than two months of reading achievement during summer break.
- Low-income children lose even more.
- The loss accumulates with each summer break.
- By high school, children can be years behind in reading skill.

What if you could **prevent** summer learning loss?



2016 Crichton Elementary Greenbrier County

Read Aloud gave six books to each student to celebrate the end of the school year.

We repeated the project each year.

Crichton's reading scores started to rise.

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
Summer Book Binge

Is based on research from Tennessee:

Give children books they love for summer break.

It is better than summer school.

Especially for low-income students.





Children browse a variety of titles.

They 'order' six.



Volunteers put each child's name in their books. They pack each child's 'order' in a reusable tote.



Distribution Day!



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Adults make the event special.


Every child's name is called.



Each family receives a reminder:

Children retain or even gain skill when they read for fun.

• 2015: **30 percent** of Crichton students scored proficient in reading.

• 2018: **57.58 percent** of Crichton students scored proficient in reading.

Spring 2020: Schools closed by COVID

 Read Aloud WV and non-profit First Book created a new distribution method.

 Working with First Book, Read Aloud shipped about eight books each to 1,700 children at home.

 First Book used Read Aloud's methods with other groups around the country.



Read Aloud was invited by First Book to speak at its national webinar.

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2021 Pandemic effects

Schoolwide, only 24 percent of Crichton scored proficient in reading.

In fifth grade, 50 percent of students scored proficient.

One difference: Crichton 5th graders had Summer Book Binge every year since kindergarten.

84 percent of 4th graders at Gilmore and Cottageville maintained or gained reading skill during Summer 2022.

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
Success! Kanawha County

53 percent of Chesapeake Elementary students maintained or gained reading skill over summer 2022.

Conclusion:

In every Summer Book Binge school where we could get data, results matched the research.

Students maintained or gained reading skill over summer break.




Volunteer readers motivate children to read for fun


- Model reading for pleasure.
